One of our members made a beautiful cushion at the Tuesday morning meeting. When asked where she had found the pattern she told me that she had bought it from one of the shopping channels but she couldn't remember which one, she thought it might have been Hochanda (Free view channel 84) but she couldn't be sure.

So I tried these channels myself in one of my weeks when I was unable to leave the house and I have to say that I was unimpressed at the time, so this morning I decided that since Susan Briscoe was to give a demonstration of Sashiko on The Sewing Quarter, I would stick it out and watch it all through. Needless to say, my daughter rang on her way home from Canada so I missed some of it but fortunately I was able to pick up the piece I missed from the website.

I should stress that these are all selling channels and so there is some pressure on purchasing fabrics and notions. The fabrics are perhaps a little more expensive than in some shops but if you do not have ready access to a shop then you have to factor that in.

I have always been a sucker for sashiko and before the end of the morning I was getting out the relevant fabrics and threads, all ready to have another go, it is quite addictive.

Please tell us your experiences of these channels. I believe Create and Craft is precisely that, heavy on the craft and the Sissex And Go machines for making cards which do look great but unless you are going into production or you have an outlet where you can sell your work, it must be quite an expensive hobby.

I know that some of our members have these machines and it would be nice to see them used with some of the patchwork dies (is this what they are called?)

Perhaps we could have an evening of making some cot quilts where we bring along our own material to be cut into the right shapes and then can go away and make a small quilt.
